BALLOTS READY FOR JUNE

Traveling this summer? Don't forget to vote. Greene County Clerk Richard Struckhoff announced today absentee ballots are available for those voters who are unable to go to their polling place on June 6th. "Only Springfield voters are eligible to participate in this special election," Struckhoff said. Just one issue on the ballot: the City is asking its residents to approve 615-million dollars in revenue bonds for a new power plant.

Absentee ballots may be voted in the Clerk's office on the first floor of the Greene County Courthouse (Room 113), 940 Boonville, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday, until the day before the election. Missouri law limits the use of absentee ballots to voters who will be out of the county on election day, or who are ill or incapacitated, or for other legal reasons.

Homebound or out-of-town voters may request an absentee ballot by mail. Those requests must be signed by the voters and received in the clerk's office no later than 5:00 p.m. on the Wednesday prior to the election (May 31st). Mailed ballots must be voted, notarized, returned by mail, and received in the clerk's office before 7:00 p.m. on election day.
